- Only letters written exclusively to the Times Union will be considered for publication, and only if the writer's name and city, town or village of residence can also be published. We do not accept form letters, chain letters, letters that

have been posted on websites, or letters that have been prepared by anyone other than the individual who has signed it.

- Letters must include the writer's name, address and daytime phone number so that we can contact you to verify the letter (we will not publish your street address and phone number, only your name and the community in which you live).
- We prefer letters to have one author, two at most, except in unusual circumstances.
- Letters published in the newspaper will also appear in the opinion section of timesunion.com.

Letters should preferably be 150 to 175 words, should refer to an article that has appeared within the last seven days, and must include the writer's address and phone number. Writers of letters selected for publication will be notified within a week. Letters may be edited and shortened for space.
