

A political scientist, in December 2002 I retired from SUNY Albany. That brought to a close, at age 65, my university career spanning 39 wonderful years, including 35 at SUNY Albany. I remain active in research and publication; occasionally teaching and consulting abroad; serving as a member of various boards in the Albany Capital Region; as a political pundit with local media; plowing through a long list of books I'm determined to read; as family member and friend and theater-goer; and, weather permitting, power-walking five miles daily.

Still I have time and energy to devote to retiree affairs, especially as they involve SUNY retirees and the UUP.

As chair of the statewide Committee on Active Retired Membership (COARM) in UUP, I would have these major priorities:

1) to promote organizing the nearly 3,000 SUNY retirees, for three purposes: (a) to widen and deepen, formally and/or informally, the involvement of the SUNY retirees, via the statewide COARM organ, in selected key aspects of UUP activity, including collective bargaining; (b) to foster statewide COARM's networking with private-sector university and college retirees throughout New York state; and (c) to foster ties between the SUNY retirees, via the statewide COARM organ, and other retiree organizations in the public and private sectors throughout New York state.

(2) to promote the establishment of an organized retiree group in each of the nearly four dozen SUNY units, to foster the intellectual, service and social activities of the groups and their individual members (a) within the organized retiree groups in the

SUNY units; (b) within the larger SUNY unit of which the organized retiree group is a part; (c) within the seven regional areas, each with its own COARM committee, comprising COARM/UUP throughout New York state; and (d) nationally and internationally.

Achieving these goals will help to position the SUNY retirees, via the seven regional committees and the statewide COARM organ, to exert significant influence on policy decision making affecting the retiree community, within SUNY and more widely. For these purposes, I will lend strong encouragement to organized retiree groups in the individual SUNY units, working in conjunction with the seven regional COARM committees and the statewide COARM organ, to seek funding from diverse sources, among them, principally, campus administrations; the UUP; and the public, private and foundation sectors.

I believe in the UUP union. The leaders have worked very hard to give their members fabulous benefits and salaries. We would not be where we are without their efforts. I want to thank them for all

they did for us.
